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# 1. Introduction

The National University of Ireland (NUI) is a federal university comprised of four constituent universities (all designated awarding bodies) and two recognised colleges (one a linked provider, the other a designated awarding body). NUI is responsible for ensuring that the quality of education and research programmes developed and delivered by the recognised colleges is comparable to that in the constituent universities.<sup>1</sup>

## 2. Purpose

The purpose of this Senate document is to articulate the quality and quality assurance and enhancement standards expected of NUI member institutions.

## 3. Scope

This policy applies to all NUI member institutions: constituent universities and recognised colleges, whether designated awarding bodies (DABs) or linked providers, and colleges associated with constituent universities.<sup>2</sup> This policy is intended to complement the suite of quality policies and procedures in member institutions, which will have a greater level of detail, specific to the identity and mission of the individual institution.

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1 This is the role of the NUI Administration but is also a statutory obligation in the case of the linked provider.

2 Additional policies, guidelines and regulations apply to recognised colleges and linked providers.

## 4. Principles

There are four core principles of this policy:

1. All member institutions share responsibility for the upholding of NUI quality standards and the reputation of the federal university.
2. All member institutions will develop and maintain quality assurance policies and procedures that align with European and Irish standards for higher education providers.
3. All member institutions will undergo relevant external institutional review in accordance with statutory requirements. In the case of DABs, this will be arranged by QQI. In the case of linked providers, external review will be arranged by NUI. Colleges associated with NUI constituent universities will have external reviews arranged by the relevant constituent university.
4. All member institutions will develop and maintain quality assurance policies and procedures that align with applicable NUI policies, regulations and guidelines, as agreed by NUI Senate.<sup>3</sup>
