In September 2022, Dublin City Council erected a commemorative plaque to mark the site of the medieval church of St Olave at Fishamble Street, Dublin.

Olaf II Haraldsson, also called Saint Olaf of Norway, was born c.995 AD and died July 29, 1030. After his death, his cult spread rapidly to Scandinavian colonies overseas, including Dublin, Waterford, York, and Novgorod. St Olave's Church, Dublin is not documented until the late twelfth century, however, it was founded sometime in the mid-eleventh century.

In this seminar, a panel of national and international speakers will discuss the origins of the cult of the saint in Norway and how it spread overseas. Thus, placing the church of St Olave in context.
